“Dr. Edith Halcomb was educated both in high school and State Normal School and graduated at the Des Moines College of Osteopathy and afterwards took a post graduate course in Osteopathy, and is a Chiropractic graduate as well. Dr. Halcomb was with the college last year” (p. 10).



“Mary Parks Putnam, M.D., received her degree from the College of Physicians & Surgeons, Boston, Mass., where she was in actual practice for 25 years. Previously she graduated from a medical college in Vermont; for many years she taught in the public schools of New Hampshire. She was president of the alumni association of her Alma Mater for many years. Dr. Putnam has had considerable experience in newspaper correspondence and is now engaged in her profession and teaching. Dr. Putnam was with the California Chiropractic College last years as instructor of Obstetrics” (p. 11).



“T. Oren Watson, D.O., D.C., graduated from the Western School of Osteopathy in June, 1906, and practiced in the State of Washington for five years.
