
Chronology of Virginia Boydjieff, D.C.

The front cover of this Journal shows her with the panel members of the famed CBS-TV show, "What's My Line?" Shown left to right, Miss Dorothy Kilgallen, widely read New York columnist; Bennett Cerf, author, writer, and editor; Miss Arlene Francis, Broadway and TV actress; Dr. Boydjieff; Hal Block, comedy writer; and John Daly, newscaster, eminent columnist and moderator of "What's My Line" Dr. Boydjieff drew enthusiastic applause from the studio audience on appearance; but her vocation did not long remain a secret to the panel.

Chiropractic again hit the airwaves last month when over eleven million Americans viewed the Fred Allen show "JUDGE FOR YOURSELF." The beautiful and gracious Dr. Virginia Boydjieff of Reading, Pennsylvania, a guest on that show, was given the opportunity of explaining chiropractic and she certainly made the most of the occasion.

About one year ago Dr. Boydjieff appeared on the John Daly show, "WHAT'S MY LINE," telecast over the CBS network.

During the NCA-CCA Convention last July Dr. Boydjieff made two appearances on TV in Los Angeles, and was interviewed on a CBS radio program covering fifteen states, as arranged by Dr. Arnold Pike, Gene Curtis and the publicity committee, headed by Dr. Floyd Cregger.

Dr. Virginia Boydjieff, formerly of Reading, Pa., is now practicing in association with Dr. Raymond H. Houser at Mt. Ecclesia, Oceanside. Dr. Boydjieff obtained her California license in 1948 and has re-visited since then, particularly at the CCA-NCA convention

when she appeared on a number of radio and television programs as "the best looking doctor in the United States."

Drs. Houser and Boydjieff are now conducting an out-patient practice at the Mt. Ecclesia Sanitarium that formerly was operated by the Rosicrucian Fellowship. Alterations and installations are under way to permit re-opening the 35-bed sanitarium with its outstanding and complete facilities, of which the treatment departments are now in use.
